Rose Paves the Path to Self-Sufficiency

Rose is a single mother who worked as an executive assistant for a big company for eight years. Just as her daughter started thinking about college, Rose found out she was pregnant and was laid off from her job. She was alone, pregnant and unemployed with a teenager still at home. In the midst of her crisis, she found out she had a rare blood disorder that required emergency surgery. NFCC was there to help her with food and assistance. She took the opportunity to learn skills and better herself while she was out of work. She came to NFCC for job coaching classes, computer classes, budgeting workshops and financial planning. When Rose did get back on her feet with a new job, she also had a



new arsenal of skills. She wrote a book, started a company, started a savings account for her new son and is currently working on second book. This would not have been possible without the generous support of our donors.

Self-Sufficiency Puts Money Back into the Community

After completing NFCC Classes, surveyed participants are earning \$10.50 or more per hour! That equates to approximately \$1,547,520 in gross earnings returning to our community and government services.

The Education Center at NFCC helps families move toward financial stability and self-sufficiency by offering free adult basic education and life skill classes including English, GED test preparation, financial and computer literacy, workforce readiness and more. Thanks to our volunteer instructors, classes are free and open to our community space permitting. On-site childcare is provided at no cost to participants for most evening and weekend classes.
