

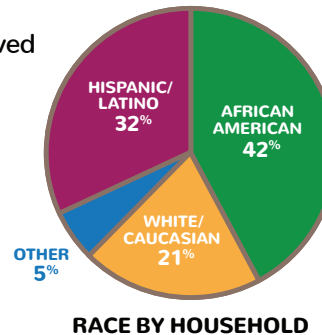
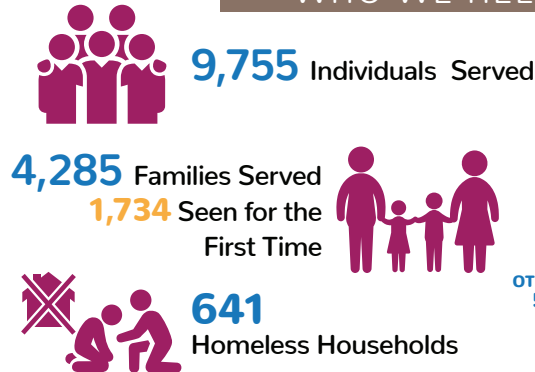


Our thanks to all donors, volunteers, friends and supporters who made it possible for NFCC to

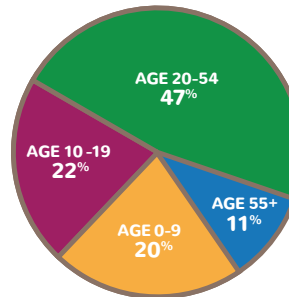
RACE BY HOUSEHOLD

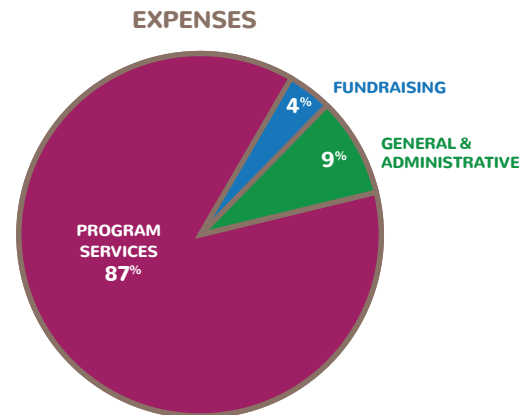
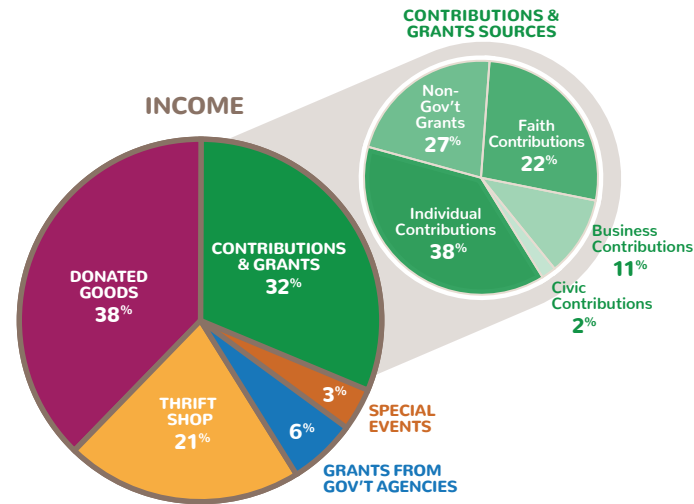
