

## Lack of Affordable Housing Shapes Gina's Story

Gina is one of NFCC's newest board members, but her story starts with a search for housing that was affordable, an ongoing struggle in North Fulton. As a single mother holding down two jobs, Gina was always on the lookout for housing that was both safe and economical. As a City of Roswell employee, she looked for a place close to work in North Fulton where she eventually qualified for a Habitat for Humanity home. While she waited for that opportunity, NFCC helped Gina make ends meet with food from the food pantry and occasional help with the bills. When her car was beyond repair, NFCC provided her with a donated one from our car donation program. Gina was lucky because she did have access to affordable housing. That's not the case for most North Fulton residents today. The Alpharetta-Roswell Herald recently reported that "Roswell and Alpharetta are among the state leaders in average annual price growth for apartments." Affordable housing in North Fulton continues to shrink which makes it almost impossible for most of our essential workers such as teachers, police officers, fire fighters, nurses, hospitality and customer services workers to live in the communities that they serve.

This year's event will be on Saturday, August 3, followed by a teacher restocking day for teachers from Title I schools on Sunday, August 4.

- 219 local immigrants are learning English, and becoming more independent and employable.
- 5 GED students have graduated and 35 students are hoping to join them.
- Our Financial Literacy classes and coaching sessions, helped 41 individuals with budgeting and credit issues.
- Job coaching and Career Mentoring services helped 54 individuals find a job or pursue further education and certification.
