Working Together To Help

Diane* came to NFCC fleeing domestic violence with her infant and toddler. She came with nothing, but the clothes on her back. NFCC collaborates with other agencies in our community as part of the North Fulton Housing Continuum of Care and helped connect them to the Drake House, a housing program for women with children. However, due to a delay, they needed to wait a week until the space was ready. NFCC case workers jumped into action to provide a short-term hotel rental until space was available at the Drake House. NFCC immediately set them up with food, diapers, clothing and everything they needed to be comfortable until their space was ready. It took incredible strength for "Diane" to leave everything behind for the safety of herself and her children and our community once again shows that together, we can help!

NFCC Completes \$6.2M Capital Campaign

We are excited to announce NFCC has completed our three-year \$6.2 million dollar capital campaign to expand the agency with the construction of a new service center, named after long-time NFCC executive director Barbara Duffy, as well as an expansion and remodel of the Thrift Shop and food pantry.

"When we started the Growing with Purpose capital campaign three years ago, we knew we needed to expand to continue to serve the growing needs of our community," said NFCC Executive Director Holly M. York. "We had no idea that we would face a global pandemic that would increase the need for our services faster than we could have anticipated. With the support of everyone who donated to this campaign, we now have the

resources and infrastructure to serve the thousands of families that have been disproportionately affected by the pandemic. We can help ease their hardship with food, clothing and financial assistance while fostering their financial stability through classes, job coaching, mentoring and workforce development programs."

Since opening in April, the Barbara Duffy Center has been bustling with activity. Living our updated mission to help ease hardship and foster financial stability in our community, hundreds of individuals have already found help in the new center.

- Completed and filed over 350 tax returns at no cost
- 25 GED students currently enrolled with help from 13 GED tutors
- 90+ English as a second language students enrolled in 5 different levels of summer classes
