

Dear Friends and Supporters,

As I look back on 2024, I am filled with gratitude for the incredible community of supporters that rally around the mission of North Fulton Community Charities. With your help, NFCC served 9,563 people in need in 2024.

This year, as NFCC has done for the past 41 years, we sought out better and more impactful ways to support those in need. Here are just a few highlights of how we worked toward our three strategic pillars: Serve More, Serve Better and Serve Well.

Serve More

Your support helped us expand our education and workforce programs to help our neighbors toward more stable and prosperous futures. Enrollment in our English classes increased by 31 percent after introducing satellite classes at partner churches. In October, we hosted our first ever multi-employer job fair, providing more than 200 job seekers the opportunity to connect with employers. In addition, attendance at financial and career coaching and workshops continued to grow.

Serve Better

We expanded our client surveys and made improvements to our programs based on the valuable feedback, such as expanding Family Choice, our Thrift Shop assistance program by increasing monthly points and improving selection. We completed the buildout of the Barbara Duffy Center's second floor, creating more classrooms and additional space for clients and students to gather as well as opportunities for NFCC's future growth.

Serve Well

We implemented new technology that allows for quicker registration and check-in at the food pantry and our seasonal programs. We piloted a program with DoorDash's Dash Pass that allows neighbors with mobility challenges to access our pantry's offerings. Our own garden continues to provide fresh produce, our number one requested item, harvesting 333 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables.

Thank you for walking alongside us as we work toward our vision: **A community where all neighbors flourish.** Together, we are building a stronger community—one family at a time!

Food Pantry

3,883 Families received food and other basics. **55.58** Million in food distributed.

NFCC's food pantry provides North Fulton families facing food insecurity with access to fresh and nonperishable food and other household items. As a client choice pantry, NFCC utilizes a computer-based ordering system that provides a dignified client experience and reduces food waste.

- 59,301 pantry orders were filled, a 16% increase from last year.
- NFCC's garden produced 333 pounds of fresh produce.
- A pantry delivery program using DoorDash® was introduced, providing increased access to food for a limited number of mobility challenged clients.



1,872 Households served. 118,065 Items distributed.

Family Choice helps families reduce their monthly expenses by providing points to use in the thrift shop for clothes, shoes and other items.

- \$565,460 in essentials were distributed to families in need, an increase of 13% over last year.
- Efforts to improve the program resulted in a higher number of participants.
- Updates included increasing the number of monthly points for each participant and the types of items that can be purchased with points.





® Financial Assistance

1,121 Families avoided eviction and utility shut-off in 2024.

NFCC's financial assistance and case management program provides emergency payments for rent and utilities to families experiencing a crisis. Clients receive compassionate guidance and connections to resources to help improve their stability.

- \$1.28 Million in emergency funds distributed.
- 93% of families remained in their home at the 90-day check-in.

NFCC Helped 9,563 Neighbors in Need in 2024



Education

605 adults gained skills and credentials from ESL classes, GED tutoring and computer skills training.

NFCC's education program offers classes and tutoring to help our neighbors open doors to new employment opportunities, increase their wages and improve their financial stability.

- NFCC served 515 English-as-a-Second-Language students, increasing enrollment by 31% over the past year.
- Three satellite classes were launched at partner churches, including St David's Episcopal, Bridge to Grace and Mt Pisgah.
- 73 Students participated in GED tutoring. 10 students earned their GED certificate.



322 neighbors took part in our workforce development program.

NFCC's workforce development program equips participants with tools and strategies to secure higher paying jobs and advance their careers.

• 208 Job seekers attended our first-ever job fair in October. Many made valuable connections and several reported job offers on the spot.



🐿 Seasonal Assistance

1,200 household served through our seasonal assistance program.

- 495 seniors received baskets
- 1,089 backpacks distributed
- 1,956 coats distributed
- 495 families received food for Thanksgiving
- 1,370 children received toys




Volunteers served **61,959** hours – the equivalent of **30** full-time employees.
